Now in its third year, Design Centre, Chelsea Harbour's WOW!house has become a firm fixture, with the announcement of participating designers and showrooms an eagerly awaited event in its own right. From June 4 to July 4, the installation will once again see a linear house snaking its way room by room along the Design Avenue. Each space is imagined by a different design studio, from established names to rising stars; most have teamed up with one of the Design Centre's showrooms to bring their ideas to life. This year, designers taking part include Lucy Hammond Giles, Sibyl Colefax & John Fowler associate director and *House & Garden* Interior Designer of the Year 2023, who is creating a morning room using fabrics from the Colefax Group. Studio Vero has created a kitchen in collaboration with Martin Moore, while a study is the work of one of this magazine's Rising Stars in 2023, Anahita Rigby. Three bedrooms have been designed by Veere Grenney, Will Fisher and Charlotte Freemantle of Jamb, and Tolà Adèkó. Veere's room will include designs from his collection with Schumacher, while Charlotte and Will are creating a romantic space anchored by a reproduction of a Chippendale four-poster. Tolù, who is working with Zimmer + Rohde to introduce glamour in the form of leather, embroidery and marquetry, says, 'It's a designer's dream to get creative and work without a brief.' dcch.co.uk Christobel Chubb \triangleright
